D-U-N-S Number assignment is FREE for all businesses required to register with the US Federal government for contracts or grants.

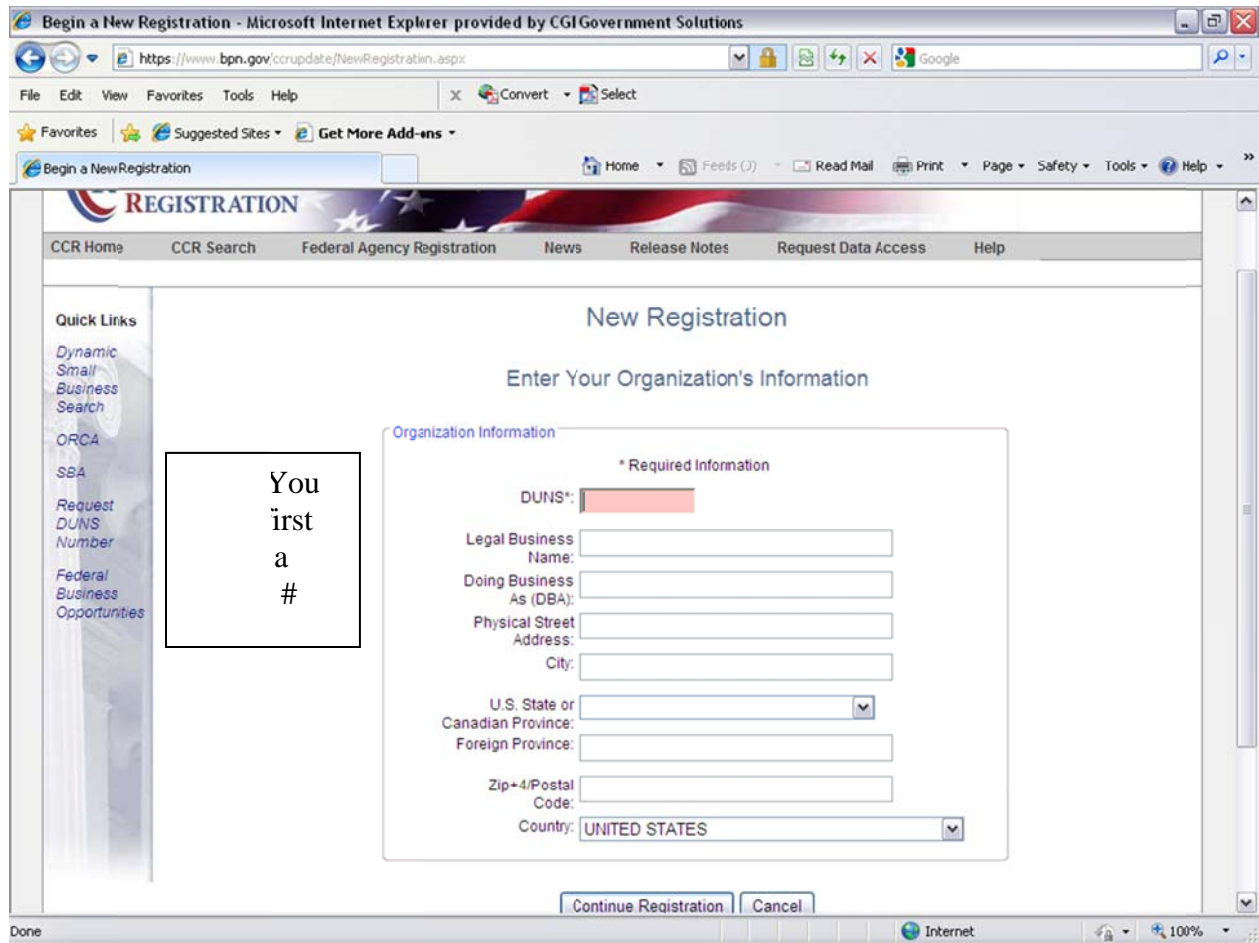
- You will need to provide:
 - Name of organization
 - Organization address
 - Name of the CEO/organization owner
 - Legal structure of the organization (corporation, partnership, proprietorship)
 - Year the organization started
 - Primary type of business
 - Total number of employees (full and part time)
- You should have a DUNS # for each property for which you are reporting.
- Ensure that the TAX ID # and the Address you use matches that of your tax return.
- **Please note:** Obtaining a DUNS number places your organization on D&B's marketing list that is sold to other companies. You can request not to be added to this list during your application.
- By using the web form, the process should take 1-2 business days.

- Be Sure to request your FRPIN from your Point of contact in the CCR
